HOPSCOTCH ASIAN WOMEN'S GROUP AT SWISS COTTAGE

Justyna Bakula, the Swiss Cottage Leisure Centre Health and Well-Being Champion, is working in partnership with Hopscotch Asian Women's Centre to provide the group with a 6-week free sport and physical activity taster programme, using the Swiss Cottage Programmable Area. The group take part in a range of exercises and are supported by a Better Fitness Instructor.

The sessions are followed by social time in Del'Aziz Café, where the ladies enjoy refreshments and healthy snacks. The ladies all feel very at home at Swiss Cottage, already enquiring about other leisure activities and memberships, and took part in the 2019 Swiss Cottage annual brochure photoshoot.



A BETTER JOB IN LEISURE

Better Camden launched a new apprenticeship and employability programme in partnership with the Somers Town Job Hub and GLL College. Following interviews, 9 Camden citizens have been identified and will undertake various training courses delivered through both the GLL College and Job Hub to become either a Customer Service Assistant or Recreational Assistant.

All 9 citizens completed their Emergency First Aid at Work Course at Oasis Sports Centre and are on their way to a Better job in leisure. Exciting conversations are also happening with Camden's Employment Services team to explore more opportunities. BETTER TEAM UP WITH NORTH CAMDEN ZONE TO DELIVER CHALCOTTS CUP

The North Camden Zone, a project of The Winch, aims to improve life outcomes for children and young people. Their goal is to make the local area a great place to live and to grow up, which mirrors Better's community values. The North Camden Zone co-ordinates activities for the following estates: Chalcott, Hilgrove & Harben, and Harrold. In partnership with The North Camden Zone, Better Camden supported citizens with the use of Swiss Cottage Leisure Centre Astroturf.

The Chalcotts Cup consisted of two football tournaments, one for juniors and one for adults. 45 players took part across the two competitions with more than 50 spectators supporting their fellow community members; one of the local citizens commented, "Great afternoon, good community cohesion, a lovely turn out, many thanks to all!"

Better look forward to working in partnership with the North Camden Zone delivering future events to further improve community cohesion.



100% FOR CALTHORPE LIVING LAB

Better pledged £1250 to help The Calthorpe Project achieve 100 % of their £13,720 crowdfunding target. Based in the Kings Cross Ward of Camden, The Calthorpe Project is a valuable community resource and green space in Central London, an Eco Oasis that exists to improve the physical and emotional well-being of Camden citizens. Through the GLL Community Foundation, Better Camden have supported The Calthorpe Project with funding to further improve their facilities, specifically the Living Lab which enables growing of plants.

Environmental and food-growing sessions have taken place, encouraging and developing awareness of organic methods and composting. Through new learning around growing plants and sustainable living, new community groups have formed to create mini allotments.

The event was attended by 5t Pancras and Somers Town citizen Robbie 'The Camden Caretaker' Chapman. Robbie dominated the amateur scene and turned professional in 2018; he has won all of his 3 pro fights tool Robbie is committed to giving back to the community, promoting the rewards of physical activity. Positive mental health is important to deal with the challenges of everyday life, and sport can help that. 60 young people were joined by youth

organisations including Fitzrovia Youth Action, Kings Cross Brunswick and Queen's Crescent Community Association, who were all supported by Camden Councillors Hai, Robinson, Khatoon, Boyland and Callaghan. Better challenged young people and youth workers to take part in 3 rounds of exercise; this involved sustaining a plank, squat and a lateral raise. Better gave out youth leaflets and merchandise, and promoted all Better facilities and programmes.
