Hailed as "America's Foodiest Small Town" by Bon Appétit magazine, Chapel Hill is a hot spot for local farm to table cuisine. Among the restaurants noted nationally are Crook's Corner (Garden & Gun), Sunrise Biscuit Kitchen (The Splendid Table), and Lantern Restaurant (Food & Wine magazine, etc.). Stop by II Palio and Crossroads Chapel Hill, both AAA four-diamond delicious! In Carrboro, Bon Appétit magazine named Neal's Deli a top ten sandwich shop in the country and the new Pizzeria Mercato (photo) is one of AFAR magazine's 10 favorite Neapolitan Pizzerias in the U.S. Aaron Vandemark, chef of Panciuto in Hillsborough is a six-time James Beard nominee. Visit five county farmers' markets to see where many local chefs shop. Try our multiple craft beer breweries and spirits distillery. Don't forget the new Blue Dogwood Public Market on West Franklin Street.
