FIND OUTDOORS The Cumberland Valley offers hundreds of miles of trails in three state parks for the whole family to explore. Uncover the rolling hills and scenic landscape of the Valley while hiking, biking or horseback riding on the Cumberland Valley Rail Trail or enjoy the lakeside beach at Laurel Lake, where you can swim, kayak and boat. We can't forget about the world-famous Appalachian Trail, which flows through the region.



FIND SPEED Discover your need for speed at the famed Carlisle Events auto shows, where over 500,000 attendees come from across the world to admire new and classic vehicles at eight events, including the eminent Corvette show and parade. Pit stops along the way include Williams Grove Speedway and the Rolls Royce Museum.



FIND **HISTORY** In between the tree-lined streets of historic downtown Carlisle is where you'll find history on display, including the story of Olympic athlete Jim Thorpe and the Carlisle Indian School at the Cumberland County Historical Society. You'll also encounter the monument to the Revolutionary War heroine, Molly Pitcher. History buffs won't want to miss the artifacts and interactive exhibits at the U.S. Army Heritage & Education Center.



FIND **BREWS** Tap, tour, and try a pint on the Cumberland Valley Beer Trail, where you'll uncover the Revolutionary War themed Molly Pitcher Brewing Company, with a variety of different tastes and flavors. Other brew destinations include Market Cross Pub & Brewery, Appalachian Brewing Company, and Al's of Hampden, offering 100+ craft beer options.



FIND ART The Cumberland Valley is home to many uniquely-talented artisans with work available throughout the region. Find diverse and award-winning galleries, exhibits, wood workings and one-of-a-kind crafted items. You'll be sure to leave inspired and with a memento of your Valley excursion.

Appalachian Trail

Did you know the Appalachian Trail spans 2,189 miles from Maine to Georgia, but the midway point is located in Cumberland Valley? There are 46 miles of trail that meander through Cumberland Valley, including the longest, lowest and flattest section on the entire A.T. Beyond the miles of trails, the Cumberland Valley is also home to the Appalachian Trail Museum, the only museum dedicated to hiking in the country.


