HISTORICAL ATTRACTIONS & SIGHTS 4 DAY/5 NIGHT ITINERARY DISCOVER THE WORLD'S MOST FAMOUS BEACH

Day One: After a leisurely breakfast at a hotel of your choice, take a drive down to the southern-most point of the Daytona Beach area, Ponce Inlet. The spectacular **Ponce DeLeon Inlet Lighthouse**, the tallest lighthouse in Florida, this majestic facility stretches 175 feet into the sky. Next, treat yourself to an environmental odyssey at Volusia County's exciting **Marine Science Center** in Ponce Inlet. The Marine Science Center offers an innovative learning experience where visitors can discover the many wonders of marine life in Volusia County, Florida. Take a ride to "The Casements" in Ormond Beach, the fully restored and former winter home of famous industrialist, John D. Rockefeller.

Day Two: Start your day right by the beach and visit **Daytona 200 Monument**, that sits on the Boardwalk in front of the Hilton Daytona Beach Oceanfront Resort. It commemorates motorcycle racing on the beach, including the first Daytona 200 race in 1937, from there drive over to **Howard Thurman Home**, this structure was once the childhood home of Rev. Dr. Howard Thurman, who created , taught and wrote about the action-oriented nonviolent philosophy championed by Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and the Civil Rights Movement. Tours are available by appointment only.

Day Three: After a leisurely breakfast at a hotel of your choice, take a drive to Mary McLeod Bethune Home & Gravesite, this National Landmark is the former home of famous civil rights leader, educator and founder of Bethune-Cookman University. Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune. Filled with fascinating artifacts and photos of Dr. Bethune's favorite VIP guests. While in Daytona Beach it's a must to visit Angell & Phelps Chocolate Factory, take a free, 20 minute tour of this chocolate factory known for its high quality, handmade chocolates, made fresh daily.

Day Four: Take a ride to "The Casements" in Ormond Beach, the fully restored and former winter home of famous industrialist, John D. Rockefeller. Later, grab your bike or hiking shoes! Some of our local treasures include two National Scenic Byways: the **Ormond Beach Scenic Loop & Trail** and the **Florida Black Bear Scenic Byway.** The Loop, an amazing flashback to pristine Old Florida, consists of 30 miles of winding canopy road along pristine waterways. The Florida Black Bear Scenic Byway connects Ormond Beach to the Ocala National Forest via some of Florida's most pristine ecosystems.
