

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When Virginia seceded from the U.S. in 1881, a line was drawn between north and south, Union and Confederacy, friend and foe. Fairfax County, Virginia, sits on that tension filled boundary, the federal capital in view as battles raged all around

As Fairfax County was then, it still is today—a hub around which some of the $\underline{\rm Civil}\, {\rm War's}$ most colorful stories took place. Let our Storyteller guide you through some of the highlights in our new video featuring sites with:

- Fascinating interpretive programs. View over 100 examples of Civil War graffiti indelibly marked on the walls throughout <u>Historic Blenheim</u>. Get a feel for how people lived during the era at <u>Sully Historic</u> Site. Then discover the soldier's experience at Fort Ward, one of the largest, best preserved Union forts, despite its location in a Confederate state.
- Civil War Trails markers. Virginia is home to more wartime military events than any other state. Learn about the battle that took the lives of two Union generals at Ox Hill Battlefield Park. Find out how the Union took hold of a key strategic site at Historic Fairfax Courthouse. And read about how Confederates receatedly attacked the Union's railroad lifeline at Devereux Station.
- · Enduring significance. Fairfax County is centrally idst battlefields stretching fro Incated am Richmond to Gettysburg. Visit the site of two major battles at nearby <u>Manassas National Battlefield</u>



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Get ready for Halloween with a highttime walk through Flint Hill Cemetery on October 24th. Local author and historian, Jim Lewis, will be your guide as you hear stories about the ceme and those who are interred there.
