Buddy Boy has grown many different kinds of grapes in the rich Appalachia mountain soil; and they pride themselves on keeping the great grape flavor in their wines. They have dry and sweet wines along

with some fruit wines. You won't be disappointed you took the country lane to this unique and welcoming winery. And be sure you get your photo with Buddy Boy before you wander off down the road.

From the outside of the beautifully reclaimed 200-year old bank barn to the wine inside the bottles at Armstrong Valley Winery, it's easy to see the owners know the art of detail. The winery and vineyard sit on 100-acres of farmland first established in 1769 by Robert Armstrong, namesake for the valley in which the winery is located and the creek that runs through the property. If the dry white wines and oak-aged red wines (Chardonnay, Riesling, Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc and Pinot Noir) win your hearts; the semi-sweet and sweet wines (Vidal blanc, Niagara, Traminette, Concord and Rose' blends) will win your soul. And the sweet fruit wines (apple, cherry, red raspberry, strawberry, peach, mixed berry) will likely win a place in your wine rack at home.

The new Tröegs brewery location opened in the fall of 2011 near Hersheypark and The Outlets at Hershey. This this 90,000 square-foot facility has since become a destination among the town's existing attractions. The new facility dubbed "T2" during construction was designed to be a unique brewing experience for Tröegs' guests, featuring a 5,000 square-foot tasting room that opens into an outdoor seating area, all with ample views of the brewhouse. Brewery goers are able to observe the brewing process first-hand and even take a self-guided tour along a window-lined hallway for an up-close view of the brewery. Tröegs also provides guided tours of the brewhouse on designated days.
