The Basics ▶ You don't need to be a Hawai'i resident or a U.S. citizen to be married in the islands. There's no waiting period and blood tests are not required. Nevertheless, you must (1) complete a marriage license application,
(2) you and your spouse must appear together before an official marriage license agent,
(3) currently, a marriage license will cost you
\$65, payable in cash only, (4) your license will be valid for 30 days, and (5) a marriage certificate will be mailed to you after your ceremony.

Local Customs ► According to island tradition, Hawaiian lei are worn by both bride and groom – a lei of flowers or a woven floral headband for her and an open strand of fragrant maile leaves for him.
