How to get there

Access to the Crevasse Moraine Trail System is located at the south end of Loma Prieta Drive. From Palmer- go west on the Palmer-Wasilla Highway, 2 miles west of downtown Palmer take a left on Loma Prieta Drive, follow Loma Prieta for 1/2 mile to the trailhead.

General description

Crevasse Moraine has approximately 6.7 miles (10.8 kilometers) of trails built on a network of ridges and depressions formed by glaciers. The terrain is severe in some places, so for some users the trails may be challenging. There are varying levels of difficulty and trail markers identify these from novice to expert. The Long Lake Trail connects Crevasse Moraine Trail System to Kepler-Bradley State Recreation Area trail system.

Trail uses

Crevasse Moraine Trail System is maintained by the MSB Parks and Outdoor Recreation Division for non-motorized use. Summer use includes hiking, running, mountain biking and horseback riding. During the winter months, when snow cover is sufficient, the trails are groomed for crosscountry skiing. Most loops have both classic and skate skiing tracks. Horse back riding is also allowed during the winter months on the trail that follows a well monitoring road. There are two sledding hills located near the parking area for winter fun!

* Take note

Several high school cross-country ski and running teams use the area for training and school meets, so please check for trail closures. Dog mushing is not allowed on the groomed trails during the winter because sled runners damage the ski track. During the summer months horse back riding is restricted when the trails are too wet and soft.

Dogs must be on leash and under your control at all times.
