



Marine Safety Information Bulletin (MSIB) 16-015, Hurricane Matthew

Weather Advisory
Port Condition ZULU - 12 HOUR ALERT
Time: 10:00 PM. / Date: October 5, 2016

In accordance with the National Hurricane Center forecast issued at 5:00 p.m. EDT on October 5, 2016, Hurricane Matthew is approximately 400 miles southeast of West Palm Beach. Hurricane Matthew is currently moving northwest at approximately 12 mph and expected to have a general northwestward motion over the next 24 to 48 hours. Due to the possibility of hurricane force winds entering South Florida within 12 hours, the Captain of the Port (COTP) is ordering **Port Condition ZULU** as follows:

- **10:00 p.m. October 5, 2016 - Port of Miami, Miami River, Port Everglades, Port of Palm Beach, Port of Ft. Pierce, and all remaining terminals and facilities within Sector Miami's area of responsibility.**

Authorized Operations: None unless specifically authorized by COTP Miami.

Current Actions:

- Secure all port operations and vessel movement. Only emergency vessel movements authorized.
- Oil transfer terminals should ensure that all loading arms and transfer hoses are drained of all product, blank-flanged off and secured to the deck.
- Vessels remaining in port should ballast down, have the outboard anchor at short stay, maximum mooring lines out, maintain standby power (or steam), set a navigation watch, and guard Channel 16 VHF-FM.
- Miami-Dade Bridges will be locked down starting at 8:00 p.m. October 5, 2016.
- Broward County Bridges and all other bridges in COTP Zone Miami are open but may be locked if wind strength increases.

Anticipated Future Actions: All ports in the Miami COTP Zone should be watching this storm closely and be prepared for Post Storm Recovery and Surveys.
